Tips for reviewing for the California State Board of Examiners (CBCE) Law Exam for licensure in the state of California:

Go to the CBCE website www.chiro.ca.gov and click on the “Exam Information” button to find a listing of California legal codes that contain at least one section or reference to the laws pertaining to the practice of chiropractic in the state of California. Current codes that are listed include:

Business and Professions	Education
Government	Penal
Health and Safety	Vehicle
Corporations	Welfare and Institutional
Civil Procedure	

The CBCE website also contains the Chiropractic Initiative Act, California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Division 4, which are the regulations specific to the practice of chiropractic in the state of California.

We recommend that you not only review each of the referenced sections of law, but the entire website to familiarize yourself with the ongoing meetings, deliberations and decisions of the California Board. Some laws are in the process of revision, or may be new, and you will be expected to know, understand and abide by them in your professional capacity as a Doctor of Chiropractic.

The California Law Examination for chiropractic licensure contains 50 questions that may reference the law in any/all of the above codes or regulatory sections.

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners recommends that its site be reviewed monthly for regulatory and informational updates.
